
Crown Pointe Academy will be in compliance with all State of Colorado laws, and the Charter Authorizer's policy and regulations concerning child immunizations will be strictly enforced. Students who do not meet the requirements will be denied attendance. Transfer students will be given 60 calendar days from the date of enrollment to submit a complete Certificate of Immunization or Exemption. Revised changes to this mandatory immunization law will be applied immediately. Students may be suspended from school if immunization records are not current.

Parents/Guardians must provide one of the following to Crown Pointe Academy in order to comply with the law:

1. A completed Certificate of Immunization certifying that the student has received minimum immunizations or an Immunization record from your health care provider.
2. If a student's Certificate of Immunization is not up to date, the parent/guardian or emancipated student has 14 days after direct notification to provide documentation that the next required immunization was administered, and to submit a written plan for completion of any additional required immunizations. If the plan is not completed, the student shall be excluded from school and all school activities for non-compliance. Exception to this rule is a shortage of vaccine.
3. Statement of Exemption to Immunization Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment Certificate of Immunization:
 - a) Medical Exemption signed by licensed physician stating that the student's physical condition is such that immunization would endanger life or health or is otherwise medically contraindicated; or
 - b) Religious exemption signed by the parent, guardian, or emancipated student that the student adheres to a religious belief opposed to immunizations; or
 - c) Personal exemption signed by the parent, guardian or emancipated student that the student adheres to a personal belief opposed to immunizations

Health Requirements & Immunizations:

Colorado's immunization law for school aged children requires the following:

- Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (DTaP) - 5 doses (K to 5 or 5 to 10 yrs. of age)
- Polio (OPV) – 4 doses
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) – 2 doses
- Chickenpox (Varicella) – 2 doses
- Hepatitis B series (Hep B) – 3 doses
- Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis - (Tdap) shot (1 dose required; beginning 6th grade students or age 11-18 yrs.)
